The Mission of El Refugio Fundación

El Refugio Fundación, A.C. is located in Ensenada, Baja California, Mexico. We exist to **share God's love** and **hope** through action; providing resources and opportunities for children, teens, families and churches to grow in Christ. We partner with local churches to provide food to needy communities through our feeding program, and do visitation ministries of many sorts (prison, drug rehab, migrant camps, etc.) to provide whatever aid and support we can while sharing from the Word of God. We facilitate short term mission teams in various ministries including house builds, construction projects benefitting the community, and ministry outreaches in many different settings. Teams also have the opportunity to work alongside the girls at Casa Esther and pour into the girls lives during their time with us.

Our Goal

Our goal is to work through the local community leaders to affect change in their areas. We highly recommend the book "Helping Without Hurting in Short-Term Missions" by Steve Corbett and Brian Fikkert as you prepare your team for your mission trip, as well as "Foreign to Familiar" by Sarah A. Lanier. We want this to be a great experience for your group as well as the ministries you serve in!

Casa Esther

Our primary ministry is Casa Esther; a girls safe house in a family setting located on the premise of El Refugio, for teens and pre-teens who have been rescued from situations of violence, abuse, neglect, and/or prostitution/trafficking.

At Casa Esther our desire is to **provide a safe, supportive, and loving environment** where abandoned and at-risk children and teens are given the opportunity to get an education, receive counseling to resolve the pain they have suffered, learn invaluable life skills, and receive biblical training to help each individual grow and develop towards their full potential physically, emotionally, educationally, and spiritually. We want them to become upstanding citizens who love God and can affect change in their communities!

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Ten Commandments for Mission Trip Participants

- 1. You shall not forget that you represent your home country and the Lord Jesus Christ.
- 1. You shall not expect that things will be the same as they are at home, for you have left your home to find different things.
- 2. You shall not take minor things too seriously. Accepting things as they are paves the way for a good mission trip.
- 3. You shall not judge all [Mexicans] by the one person with whom you have had trouble.
- 4. You shall not let other group members get on your nerves. You raised good money and set aside this time. So, enjoy yourself.
- 5. You shall not be overly worried. The person who worries has no pleasures. Few things people worry about are ever fatal.
- 6. Remember your passport (or other identification document) so that you know where it is at all times. A person without documents is a person without a country.
- 7. Blessed is the person who says "thank you" in any language. Verbal gratefulness is worth more than tips.
- 8. When in Mexico (Rome), do as the Mexicans (Romans) do. If in difficulty, use common sense and your native friendliness.
- 9. Remember, you are a guest in Mexico. He who treats his host with respect shall be treated as an honored guest.

Okay, so these aren't the 10 commandments given to Moses on Mt. Sinai. However, the principles enunciated here are foundational to success in short-term cross-cultural experiences. So, violating these 10 commandments (even if Moses didn't get them) can spoil your short-term experience and even tarnish your attempts to witness for Christ. And most of all, remember to be FLEXIBLE!

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Bedding

Option 1: Your team may decide to bring your own bedding or sleeping bag. We will provide a fitted sheet and pillow.

Option 2: Buy two blankets that you may take back with you as a souvenir or donate to the ministry to allow us to bless families/individuals in need. (\$30 USD for 2 blankets that may be in different styles) We will provide sheets and a pillow.

Towels

Each team member will need to bring a towel/washcloth/toiletries.

Deposit Fee

- **Team Registration**: To reserve your date, please register your team by completing the group application form (page 15) as well as \$500 USD nonrefundable deposit. For dates in July, August, Easter, or Christmas we need your deposit 6 months ahead or ASAP if you're booking later than that. Lower season dates can turn in their deposit 3 months in advance, but *dates will not be reserved until we receive your deposit*.
- The paid deposit will be applied against your balance.
- The total balance is due a minimum of 30 days before arrival.

All proceeds, if any, go towards the operation of our children's safe home/orphanage, Casa Esther.

The proceeds help us to buy food and other necessities for the girls.

All prices are quoted in US dollars.

Transportation

Flying:

Due to COVID-19 restrictions, Canadians need to be aware that they MUST be fully vaccinated in compliance with US definitions. https://travel.state.gov/content/travel/en/traveladvisories/ea/requirements-for-air-travelers-to-the-us.html Check the link for the latest travel restrictions.

For anyone needing to fly, the best way is to fly in to San Diego and either have prearranged for us to pick you up or rent a vehicle that has a rental policy to drive into Mexico. Ensenada is two hours from the border. Mexico requires Mexico-specific insurance policies. Please plan on leaving Ensenada 5-7 hours before you need to be at the airport (two hours ahead of your flight). Many groups choose to leave the day prior and stay in San Diego overnight.

Borrowing a Ministry Vehicle:

If you want to help bless the home, El Refugio has two passenger vans available to borrow for a donation during your time with us! These funds help us to maintain our vehicles so they are safe for driving the girls around. Mexican roads are very hard on vehicles. Prices include a driver to safely help you over the border both directions, as well as insurance in Mexico and the USA. Prices do not include gas or tolls. You are responsible to fill the van at the end of your stay with us, as well as for the \$500 USD deductible in case of collision/theft, and any tickets you incur. *Please do not plan your departure from Mexico on a Sunday if you are borrowing a ministry vehicle. Drivers must be 21 years or older.*

Renting a Vehicle:

Or as a group, you may need to rent vehicles. It is extremely important to make certain that the place where you are renting supplies Mexican insurance on their vehicles, and if you are not from the USA, that you have insurance to cover your time in the States. (By law, you must have separate Mexican insurance).

Escort

Sometimes groups request an escort to relieve some of the stress of crossing the border into Mexico, help with transporting luggage, tourist visas, etc. We would meet you at the airport, hotel, or other location in San Diego and escort you in and out of Mexico. If your group would like assistance in this area, we would be glad to do so. *We do not provide escort services to leave Mexico on Sunday except in emergencies.* \$375 USD includes our gas both directions and 12 toll booths. *Restrictions due to COVID-19 may apply

Visas

As required by law, we request that individuals to get a tourist visa upon entry to Mexico. This is to ensure that the Mexican government legally recognizes your presence here in case of emergency, thereby requiring them to aid.

If you are in Mexico for 7 days or less, the visa is granted free of charge! If you are in Mexico more than 7 days (including day of arrival and departure), the cost is 533 pesos*, approximately \$26 USD*. The paid visa is good for multiple entries over the following 6 months. At this time, your passport can expire within those six months*, however your visa would become invalid upon the passport expiration date. You do need a valid passport for the entirety of your trip in Mexico. *This is subject to change.

You can fill out the paperwork for your visa online prior to arrival, which we highly recommend to make the process quicker at the border. We will send you an email with detailed instructions closer to your time of arrival. Your passport will need to be valid for a minimum of 6 months from the time of your trip to complete the paperwork online.

Accommodations in San Diego

If you need to stay at a hotel overnight because of your flight schedule or for a fun day, there are many options available. Be mindful that crossing the border back in to the USA can potentially take several hours. We suggest staying near the airport on Pacific Highway, where there is plenty to do within walking distance. Here is some information about a few hotels close to the airport:

You are responsible for getting yourself to/from the airport if you choose this option. Many hotels do run shuttles. Alternatively, you can opt to rent a hotel room for your driver so they can take you to the airport the following day.



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Home Building Ministry

The homes built with El Refugio are 16' X 20' and are built on a cement slab. The slab is poured prior to your team's arrival in Mexico. It is wood construction and includes shingles, siding, 4 windows, basic wiring, sheet rock, tape & mud, texture, and paint inside and out with one exterior door. Usually there are 2 small bedrooms and a small kitchen/living room area. These homes are an amazing blessing to the families who receive them. We work through local pastors who choose the families. This enables the church to reach out and encourage the people.

In some cases, it will be necessary to rent a backhoe or bring in dirt to level out a property. This costs an additional \$100-200 USD.

ADD ONS/OPTIONS:

You can choose extras to add to your family's home should you desire to do so. Once we have the family selected we will also know which options would be most suitable for your family. These are optional and are listed below. These costs will be added to the basic house cost. We highly recommend the loft and insulation for improving their quality of life!

Loft (Highly Recommended!) +\$620 USD

You may wish to consider adding a loft to the house. This will give approximately 40% more space for a "kids' loft". By dropping the ceiling joists over the bedrooms by a foot and raising the pitch of the ceiling we can create an 8'x16' loft for the kids. A staircase, floor, extra electrical is included as well as a 2'x3' window is included for ventilation and light.

Insulation (Highly Recommended!) + \$440-545 USD

4x8 sheets of 1" Styrofoam insulation will be placed in the gable ends and the ceiling.

We recommend considering this option as it does keep the house consistently cooler in summer and more importantly, warmer in the winter months.

Custom Paint +\$145 USD

Paint (usually grey) is included in the basic house cost; however, if you would like the family to be able to choose the color of their paint, inside and out, they will be given the option. The families are usually overwhelmed with joy to be able to personalize their house!

Baño (Outhouse) + \$390 USD

Many families do not have a bathroom and are in need of one. We will not know if your family needs one until they are selected.

^{**}Once we have the deposit for the foundation of \$2000 USD we require 30 to 60 days to secure a family for your house build. This deposit is nonrefundable as we pour the slab ahead of time. **



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Electrical Hookup +\$175-250 USD

Take the next step and connect the house to the meter box! Costs cover wiring and tubing.

Electrical Meter Ask for pricing

Get the power post with the meter so the family can connect to the electrical system if/when their neighborhood has access.

Laundry and Wash Center +\$195 USD

Provide a cement wash board and sink area for the family to be able to do their personal cleaning outside. Includes a sturdy wooden stand.

Solar Kit +\$390 USD

Allow the family to have electricity at a low cost. This includes a solar panel, wiring, 12-watt light bulbs, a battery, inverter, shelf and brackets, and installation. The majority of places that we build in do not have power or power is too expensive for the family to hook up.

Porch 8' x 16' + \$860 USD 8' x 20' + \$1100 USD

By extending the roofline the porch is a tremendous asset giving shade while doing laundry or cooking, etc.

Security Bars on Windows +\$395-650 USD

Putting security bars on the windows adds some extra safety and peace of mind for the family you build for.

Beds Twin bunkbed (includes 2 second-hand mattresses) +\$390 USD

Full/twin bunkbed (includes full and single second-hand mattresses) +\$485 USD

Twin platform bed (includes second-hand mattress) +\$290 USD Full platform bed (includes second-hand mattress) + \$335 USD

Twin mattress only (good for the loft area) + \$120 USD

Are there other ways to bless our family for whom we are building?

Yes! Each family may have different needs, but here are some ideas:

- Curtains and rods. You may wish to sew the curtains to size. Please see the following page regarding curtain sizes.
- Blankets, sheet sets, basic clothing, food hampers, propane stove, solar lights, solar flashlights, school supplies (backpacks, crayons, pens, pencils, sharpeners, geometry set; and for older students: solar scientific calculators, binder, etc.)

If you would like to bless your family in any of these ways, please contact us and we can discuss the specifics about your family.

Deposits for the house build are required in advance.

Deposit 1: For the foundation the deposit is due *as soon as possible* but at least a minimum of two months before your house build. When we receive this deposit a family will be picked to be blessed with a home. Please note that we will be unable to refund this deposit.

Deposit 2: The materials for the house build are purchased before you arrive. Please send in this amount *at least 45 days before* you arrive. *Refunds for this may be given on a house build up to 30 days before your arrival.*



Curtain Measurements

When building a home for a family we recommend that you purchase or sew curtains. Here are the measurements.

Windows

Inside Measurements:

2' W x 3' H: Bedroom, curtain coverage minimum 30" x 42"

2' W x 3' H: Bedroom, curtain coverage minimum 30" x 42"

2' W x 3' H: Kitchen/Living area room, curtain coverage minimum 30" x 42"

4' W x 3' H: Kitchen/Living room area, curtain coverage minimum 54" x 42"

3' W x 2' H: Loft (only needed if you are building a loft), curtain coverage minimum 42" x 30"

Consider the type of rods you will be using before you start to sew. It is usually best to buy rods that screw in just above the top of the trim. Also make sure to use thick fabric, for they will be used as privacy curtains.

Interior Doors (2):

Loft house: 36" wide, 70" long Regular house: 36" wide and 75" long

The houses do not have doors to the bedrooms. Instead they use curtains. Because of the dust and foot traffic it works best to have the bottom of the curtains above the floor by several inches.

These curtains are also hung with curtain rods. Again, **make sure the fabric used is thick**, for they will need to be privacy curtains.

Curtain Rods

Remember to bring or buy heavy, sturdy curtain rods for the windows and doors!



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Outreach Programs & Opportunities

We believe in serving in our actions and in truth. The following list are some of the ways that you may be able to serve together! House build teams may add ministry projects depending on the number of team members and their schedule.

Feeding Program Your group will prepare and cook a meal for our weekly feeding program, where you can provide food for children who often don't have enough at home. Feed their bellies and their souls as you share a Bible story and do a craft with them! *Approximately \$130-180 USD*

Migrant Camp Ministry & Aid Package Your group will provide food, toiletries, and other necessities in food hampers to be handed out to families with few resources. You will be able to share a Bible story, and play sports and games with the children. Pack a soccer ball and crayons! You will also most likely have the opportunity to support their community by buying handmade bracelets and necklaces from the women in the area. Approximately \$480 USD

Drug Rehab Ministry We have a working relationship with several drug rehabilitation centers, allowing groups to share the love of God with men, women, and their children. Come pour into their lives with testimonies and God's Word, and share a snack or a meal! *Three half-days of ministry:* approximately \$180-220 USD, dependent on number of people. One evening ministry: approximately \$80 USD.

Prison Ministry (18 years old+ ONLY) If you're ready to step out in faith, going to the men's prison will really help you grow!

Tuesday mornings at 7 AM, 5 6 male group members max. Share a snack and hand out toiletry packages and Bibles, and depending on permissions granted, preach to the inmates. We are generally allowed preaching for 1.5 hours to up to 50 men.

Saturday mornings at 7 AM, men and women allowed. Cook a meal to share with the inmates. We are generally allowed 20 minutes of preaching, and then after share a time of fellowship while eating together.

Both days are subject to cancellation in case of lockdown or rescinded privileges.

We require participants' IDs 2 months in advance to allow us to get permission for entry. Approximately \$150 USD—CURRENTLY UNAVAILABLE DUE TO COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS

Vacation Bible School, Sports Camp, and/or English Camp Work with a local church to spread God's Word in their community! Your group brings the curriculum of your choice to share with the children for 3-4 half days. Teens in the area can participate in sports (please bring equipment), and you can share your testimonies and the Word of God with them. We will provide a snack for you to serve everyone, as well as a meal on your last day together. Cost variable, approximately \$195/week for 30 kids or under, additional costs depending on number of children



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Medical Ministry Special arrangements can be made to set up a clinic in one of the villages. If you have medical personnel in your team we can work together with one of the local churches to provide much needed services. Cost Variable

Youth Drop in Center Run in one of the poorer communities, this youth drop-in gives local teens an opportunity to hang out in a safe place. Play youth games and do a Bible study with them, and provide a BBQ or pizza night! Approximately \$125-250 USD

Maintenance and/or Small Construction Project Pack your work clothes! Your group can do painting, repairs or renovation on a church, maintenance at El Refugio, pour a cement slab for a house, or meet another need that has to be fulfilled in the community! Approximately \$1,000-3,000+ USD, dependent on size of project

Large Construction Project Help us complete the girls' home educational center! When finished, the girls will have a large classroom upstairs to do their homework and tutoring, conference rooms, a small chapel/counseling room, a physical education room, and offices. Downstairs will have a large kitchen divided in two for teaching cooking and baking. Your group can take part in completing a portion of the build! Contact us to find out what phase of the construction you can help with. Variable

Homeless Ministry Go downtown early in the morning to hand out a small meal and share the Word of God with those who may have lost hope. Plan for 40-80 people. Approximately \$295 USD

*Hospital Prayer Ministry (18 years old + ONLY) Pray for the sick and hurting at the local general hospital, and hand out snacks to the staff and visitors, many of whom spend hours at their loved one's bedside. This ministry is restricted to 8 participants or less. Plan on wearing casual business dress with closed toed shoes, for warm temperatures. Participants are required to wear a lab coat (provided). Approximately \$120 USD

*Casa Abuelos Lift the spirits of the elderly who have been abandoned by their families due to lack of resources. Bring a meal, share your story and an activity, and warm their hearts! Approximately \$225 USD

Casa Esther The girls at our children's home love to spend time with team members. Located on the premises of El Refugio, you can pour in to their lives while you're here by playing sports with them, teaching Bible studies, going for walks, sitting around the campfire, doing crafts, and working alongside them in their daily routines.

Interpreter for Ministry Sites: Up to 4 hours \$25 USD/day, 4+ hours \$40 USD/day for a skilled interpreter.

If one of our girls from Casa Esther is used as an interpreter on a ministry site, we ask they be paid an honorarium as follows. This allows them to gain work experience with a marketable skill, and learn how to handle money. We ask that we be made aware of any funds given to the girls.

At the base, campfire, or devotions for 1 hour or less: optional donation

Up to 2 hours: \$12 USD Up to 4 hours: \$25 USD 4+ hours per day: \$30 USD



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Extras!

Not enough for you? Here's some more options for you to consider! Bless the girls from Casa Esther and your group with any of the following:

Pizza Party Hold a fun night for the girls in Casa Esther to interact with them, play games, and encourage them in their faith! Includes pizza for everyone, soda pop, and salad. \$100-200 USD dependent on number of people

Ice Cream Sundae Night Enjoy ice cream with the Casa Esther girls at El Refugio! Includes all the toppings. What could be sweeter? *\$50-100 USD depending on number of people*

Cheeseburger BBQ Have a BBQ with the Casa Esther girls here at El Refugio. Includes cheeseburgers with all the trimmings, fries, and soda for everyone. *\$7 USD per person including girls*

Hot Springs BBQ Take your group and the Casa Esther girls to enjoy an afternoon at the hot springs and have a BBQ! Includes admission, nachos, Italian sausages, juice, and dessert. Not available July, August, or Easter. *\$19 USD per person including girls* www.ranchosancarlosensenada.com

Las Canadas BBQ Make a splash at the waterpark and enjoy a delicious BBQ! There's lots to do, including paddleboats, pools, volleyball, a wave pool, and more. A zip line and hanging bridge course as well as horseback riding are available for an extra fee paid at the park.* Available seasonally, June-September weather permitting. \$24 USD per person including girls www.lascanadas.com/en/Home.php

*Your group can participate in the course or in horseback riding without inviting the girls from Casa Esther, but if you wish to invite any of them, we ask that all be invited.

*Trampoline Park Get your jump on! Take the girls to bounce around at Flyers, a local trampoline park with lots of different activities. Prices variable depending on day and number of participants. https://www.facebook.com/flyersensenada

*Bowling Enjoy an evening out with the girls and throw a few strikes! Snacks and food available on site for an extra cost. \$8 USD/person/hour (approximately) http://www.bahiabowlingbar.com/instalaciones/

Chinese Food Buffet Take the girls to enjoy the best Chinese food this side of the border! \$14 USD/person (approximately)

Teach a Skill Good at baking? Sewing? Woodcraft? Whatever you're good at, you can take the opportunity to teach the girls! Create a small project for them to work on with you. *Cost of materials*

Beach Time Go swimming in the ocean, collect sea shells, make sand castles, and try surfing and boogie boarding! Boogie boards \$5/each, surf boards \$10/each. Teams are responsible for repairs/replacements if they are broken or lost.

La Bufadora About a 30 minute drive from the base. You can see the second largest of 3 marine geysers in the world! There are more than 100 shops along the street where you can wander and buy your souvenirs, leading up to the blowhole. Be prepared to get splashed! www.bajabound.com/destinations/ensenada/labufadora.php

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Registration Process

The following are the initial steps and process to register your team:

1 - Contact us All bookings will initially begin with our office.

This initial contact will help us gather the necessary information to start your file and reservation. Please email our office at info@therefugemx.com. If you cannot send an email, contact us at the office using the numbers below to begin your registration process.

- **2 Deposit** All bookings are tentative until we have received your non-refundable deposit. In order to ensure your desired dates for ministry, we ask you send in your deposit six months prior to your trip.
- 3 Confirmation You will be contacted by our office staff with confirmation of your reservation and information. They will send you our payment plan, due dates, and other forms. At this point you will also receive links to important forms, information, etc.
- 4 Payments It is important that you stay on top of the payment due-dates for your team. This will help both of our teams be prepared for the upcoming projects. Please inform us through email (<u>info@therefugemx.com</u>) when you are ready to send in your payments.
- **5 Ministry Specific Planning** Prior to your team's arrival, we will be in communication with you to discuss your team's ministry details. It is at this point you will be discussing things like: male/female breakdown, who the pastor/community/family will be that you will minister with, special requests, camp programming, and the like. Please do not hesitate to contact us with questions!
- **6 Final Details** In the last few weeks before your trip, we will check to make sure we have all the details covered. The office will prepare a final invoice showing your payments/balance. The ministry sites will also be in contact to confirm any last minute details.
- **7 Post Trip Recap**. Once your trip is completed, we will process any final numbers, changes, or additional charges. The office will send you a final paid invoice.

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COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

We want everyone who decides to serve with us to feel safe and stay healthy. We are also responsible to keep our girls from the home safe and healthy! Here are the guidelines we will have your group follow.

- The COVID-19 waiver must be signed by each group member and returned to El Refugio a week before your departure.
- Face masks are required as recommended indoors or in close proximity. If you are unable to wear a facemask for whatever reason, we hope you will join us once things settle down!
- Social distancing must be respected with the girls from the home and staff indoors and outdoors.
- Temperatures may be taken. Anyone with symptoms will be required to quarantine and take a COVID test.
- Hands must be washed upon each entry in to the property (i.e.: arrival from worksite, after activities), and throughout the day. Hand sanitizer may be used in its place if soap and water are unavailable.
- At meals, hand sanitizer will be used before going through the buffet line. Masks must be worn each time you approach the buffet.
- During meals, we ask that group members sit separately and distanced from the girls from the home and staff.
- Campfires may be limited to group members only, depending on the size of the group.
- Group members must feel comfortable bunking, driving, and eating together. We are generally unable
 to provide individual rooms for group members.
- Please bring your own personal hand sanitizer to use throughout the day, as well as sufficient masks for your time with us.
- Public areas will be disinfected daily, and tables will be disinfected after each mealtime.
- Some ministry sites and activities may not be available due to COVID-19 restrictions.

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FAQ

What is the preferred dress code for El Refugio/Casa Esther and the local ministries?

There's two extremes in Mexico, between the ultra-conservative and the more modern, so a lot will depend on where your group goes to serve.

Ministry Sites: It is more culturally appropriate in some areas for the ladies to wear skirts to the knee or longer to the feeding program and to church services. We suggest leggings underneath, especially if they are playing with children or the skirts are sheer. Until you know what area you will be serving in, plan on bringing at least two, possibly three skirts to wear/rewear as necessary. Men will also possibly need pants, not shorts, for any church services. We should know what is appropriate in advance and be able to pass that information on to you.

Shorts (if appropriate for the area) must be to thumb length or longer. If anyone decides to wear leggings to any ministry site, we ask that they wear a shirt or dress long enough to cover their backside. We also ask that everyone wear shirts with sleeves to the ministry sites (short sleeves is fine), and a tank top underneath if appropriate. Men and women should bring clothes without holes or obvious stains for ministry sites and church services.

Construction Sites: If you are doing construction, **closed toe shoes are a requirement**, no exceptions. We recommend you wear jeans, not shorts, as well. Muscle shirts and tank tops are prohibited. Your clothes will be stained, so bring something to wear that is old or unwanted!

Beach: Tank tops are fine for both genders. We ask that that men do not wear speedos and ladies wear a modest bathing suit, or cover with a t-shirt. Men may wear muscle shirts at the beach only.

Base: Around the base, we ask that you dress modestly. Please refrain from wearing "short-shorts", spaghetti strap/camisoles alone, or muscle shirts.

Required Documents

You will need a passport to visit Mexico. Check your passport for the expiry date! Make certain it is valid for when you come. We will need a copy in a minimum of 3 weeks in advance with your registration paperwork, to comply with laws regulating children's homes.

Tourist Visa: We require everyone apply for a tourist visa upon arrival at the border of Mexico. This is to ensure that the Mexican government legally recognizes your presence here in case of emergency, thereby requiring them to aid. 7 days or less are free! It is easiest to fill out the paperwork beforehand online and bring a printed copy in to the immigration office with your passport. Visas for 8+ days cost approximately \$25 USD, and are good for 6 months. Further information will be sent out closer to your date of arrival. *Prices are subject to change by the Mexican government and the international exchange rate.*

Spending money

Most places in Ensenada have places to exchange money or accept American cash, so it is okay to plan to bring US money. The team will most likely wish to bring money to buy some food in the airport, or for the taco stands! We most likely will stop at a fast food restaurant before we cross into Mexico. Smaller bills are best to have on hand.



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FAQ (continued)

Health

You will need some form of travel health insurance. If you are getting immunizations to visit Mexico, tetanus and Hepatitis A & B vaccines are generally recommended, but please check with your health insurance provider. Please check with your local public health or doctor to check on updated recommendations.

Due to the current pandemic, we require participants to sign and abide by the COVID-19 waiver, as well as have an emergency plan on file with their group leader in case you need to be hospitalized or medically transported.

Food Allergies

If a participant has food allergies, please make us aware on the individual registration forms! While we will do our best to accommodate what we can, you need to bring food that is safe for you to consume to supplement what we are able to provide. It is not yet possible to buy most specialty items in Mexico, *including gluten free items*.

Weather

It does get chilly here in the evenings, and it can be quite windy at El Refugio! Plan to bring warm clothing to sleep in and a jacket for the evenings, even in the summer. Mid-day can be quite warm. As with the majority of Mexican houses, the base does not have heat or A/C. Pack your suitcase accordingly!

Gifts

Please do not bring gifts for the girls in Casa Esther without consulting El Refugio leadership. This includes donations of clothing, toiletries, etc. If you plan to leave clothing behind, please notify us before your departure from El Refugio so we can direct it to the girls or ministry areas that have the greatest need.

How will people remember God's word or be challenged by what I share?

- Offer time for discussion...for people to share what the passage means to them
